DENTAL EDUCATION IMPACT

The VCU School of Dentistry is Virginia's only dental school and the largest dental Medicaid provider in the Commonwealth, serving more than 30,000 patients a year in their on-site dental clinic and at 14 service-learning clinics around Virginia (VCU School of Dentistry)

GIVING BACK:

- 90% of Virginia dentists report that they provide care for free or at reduced cost for patients who had no insurance or coverage for the services they need (VDA Member Survey)
- Virginia dentists have donated more than \$50 million in free dental care through VDA Foundation dental clinics since 2000 (VDA Foundation Report)
